Thank you to everyone to took part in the Syderstone litter pick on Saturday 19 November. This community event takes place twice a year and is organised by the Parish Council. Usually a great opportunity for some fresh air, exercise, company and a good laugh; this year was no exception. 35 people from across our community took part, along with a number of children and at least one dog!







The collectors covered a wide area, including The Street, Creake Road, Mill Lane, Rudham Road, Docking Road, Ashside and Tattersett Road. All in all, we managed to collect 45 bags of rubbish, along with some more unusual items, many of which sadly seemed to have been fly-tipped.

A great effort all round, with thanks to the seven support helpers based at the village hall. The trailer pick up service for the full bags and bulkier items was very welcome. Everyone was rewarded by sausage, bacon and mushroom rolls together with hot drinks in the village hall afterwards, provided by a crack team in the ARVH kitchen!

Lighting up Syderstone for Christmas

As in previous years, Syderstone will be having its own Christmas tree, complete with twinkling lights, outside the Amy Robsart Village Hall. This year's tree lights 'switch-on' will be on Sunday 3rd December followed by carol singing, a licensed bar and mulled wine!

Here's what to expect:

4.00pm: Blessing of the tree and lights switch on by Father Clive Followed by Fakenham Town Band playing a selection of Christmas carols and songs (song sheets will be supplied



please bring a torch so you can see the words!)

Sunday 3rd December is the night after the next pop up bar and there will be a licence for people to enjoy the usual selection of alcoholic beverages.

This year to help with funds for the event we will be running a Christmas anagrams competition and a raffle - both to be held on the Saturday night. Raffle tickets will be £1 each/£5 per strip. The anagrams sheet at £2 per entry will be available at the coffee morning on Wednesday 29th November and at the Saturday Pop Up Pub or from either Gwyn Williams or Sarah Speake at 1 The Street. £25 will go to the winner of the anagrams competition (there will be a 'winner take all' tie break question). On the night there will be a cash collection in the village hall, organised by FRISC. This will be split 50/50 between East Anglian Air Ambulance service and supporting FRISC's continued donation towards the emptying of two of the village dog waste bins.

This event is usually a terrific opportunity for individuals and families to get together to launch the seasonal celebrations and to meet up with friends from across the community for some singing, chat and festive food. So wrap up warm and don't forget to bring a torch!


Mobility and access in Syderstone

NATURALLY SYDERSTONE - Pretty in pink

How do you tell the colour of one of Britain's most popular garden birds without even seeing it? It's easy — the chaffinch shouts it out for you. "Pink! Pink!" calls the male chaffinch, and one look at this insistent creature says it's not wrong. The male has a rosy flush all down its front, neatly offset by blue-grey crown and shoulders. If you're German, then you'll hear it call the chaffinch name. Der Fink is the finch! The female is a dowdy counterpart, trading pink for greenish-brown with buff underparts. Both sexes behave just the same — they're ground hoppers, forever bobbing about on the hunt for seeds.

Head out of your garden and into the open fields and you might spot a whole flock of chaffinches. Though it's harder to pick out detail at a distance, watch when they fly for distinctive white wing bars. And here's a curious fact; the chaffinch flocks in our East Anglian winters are visitors from Scandinavia, and they consist almost entirely of male birds — they are so-called bachelor flocks. Head to Wales, Ireland or western England and you are more likely to find all-female flocks. Nobody is quite sure why this mobile sex segregation takes place.

We can help chaffinches in the winter by putting out seed feeders, but a word of warning. It's possible to love them to death. Between around 2006 and 2018, chaffinches suffered a catastrophic decline, with numbers falling by about a third. This was almost certainly the result of human carelessness. When we don't keep bird feeders clean, they are apt to harbour disease, and a particularly virulent one called trichomonosis killed millions of chaffinches at that time. So make sure you strip down your feeders and wash them regularly. Enjoy your chaffinches and listen for them telling you they're here.
