


Norman Riches – part of Syderstone's history

The Natterjack caught up with Norman Riches who, at the end of last year, stepped down as Chairman of the village hall, a position he has held for the last 18 years. This is his story.



NJ: What motivated you to take on the role of Chair? I wanted to give something back to the village.

We moved here in 2001 and not long after Gerry Taylor, who was Chair of the Parish Council (PC) at the time, asked me to help with refurbishing the village hall car park. Over the next few years, I got more involved, becoming Chairman in 2005. At that time the hall was in a fairly bad state of disrepair. One of the first challenges was to come up with a plan to get the committee working together to tackle that.

NJ: There's been a lot of achievements over the years, what's your proudest? In 2007 the roof was in a terrible state. It felt like a massive challenge to raise the £30,000, without which the hall would become unusable. This was a huge mountain to climb, as we only had access to small bids. Working together as a team we started small, with generous donations from the PC, local businesses and grant funds. Astonishingly, the pace began to snowball and unbelievably within just six months we had the cash! Working together, the committee were really positive and supportive, and my sense of personal fulfilment started to grow as I felt that I was making a difference for the benefit of local people.

NJ: What's been the secret to the success of the village hall?

Partnerships and relationships... with the committee, the PC, the church, local businesses, local grant providers. Without their involvement and support we wouldn't have what we have today, a hall to be proud of which benefits the people of Syderstone.

NJ: What's been the 'standout' thing from the last 18 years?

Without a doubt it's the 'pop-up pubs'. These bring together people not only from Syderstone but from Wicken Green, Blenheim Park and beyond. People who wouldn't necessarily have come to the village hall. As well as being a way to generate money, these events are bringing the three communities together in a new and healthy way, which is really something to celebrate!

NJ: Thank you Norman, for your dedication and leadership over the last 18 years.

Syderstone Neighbourhood Plan

Get Involved - Consultation runs from 1 March to 31 March Drop in event at the village hall on 9 March 1pm to 4pm

If you live or run a business in Syderstone now is your opportunity to voice your opinion on how the parish should develop over the next 15 years. Syderstone Parish Council is developing a Neighbourhood Plan, which will become a key planning document produced by residents to influence the future type and location of new development in the parish.

What is a Neighbourhood Plan? It is a way of recording the preferences and wishes of our village community in a way that should help to protect and improve it.

Why do we need a Neighbourhood Plan? A Neighbourhood Plan is our way of having a say in the future of our village. It will be an important document which will sit alongside the King's Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council Local Plan. It will represent the views and aspirations of our community and can be referred to regarding local issues that are not covered by the Borough's plan.

There will be plenty of opportunities to input into the plan's development. We are running a consultation throughout March, which includes a survey that asks you about a range of topics important to residents and business owners. Each person in a household is invited to complete a survey. Copies have been posted, along with this publication, through every door in the parish.

There will be a drop in event at the village hall on Saturday 9 March 1pm to 4pm where people from the steering group will be on hand to answer any questions you have about completing the survey.

An update on what the parish council are working on...

...from Dawn Niemann, Chair of Syderstone Parish Council

I thought it might be helpful to give you a flavour of some of the things that the Parish Council (PC) does. We are working hard on the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) which you can read about on page 3; this is a vital piece of work for the village which is being progressed with tremendous help from NP Steering Group. We're also starting to look at an Emergency Plan for Syderstone too. More about this in another issue of The Natterjack.

New planters to go next to the village 'gates' will arrive shortly. We hope to plant them up in the spring. The zip wire on the playing field has recently been serviced and some parts replaced. The field and equipment are regularly checked, and the overhanging tree has been trimmed - thanks Dave Daly.

Work to repair the TROD in Rudham Road and to remove the moss on the footpath in The Street has been scheduled by the Borough Council Highways and should hopefully be completed by March. At last, we're pleased to let you know that there will be a 30-mph roundel painted on the road as you enter The Street from Docking Road. It's been scheduled by Highways although we don't have a date yet. The Speedwatch group have held several sessions and have some new volunteers too. Hopefully the 30mph roundel will help with slowing traffic.

The PC recently discussed the issue of dog fouling in the village as some people clearly aren't using bins. Syderstone is well served with dog bins throughout the village so there really is no excuse. We wanted to make you aware of the local council reporting tool so if you see a dog fouling incident and/or have information on owners who are not picking up after their dogs, then you can report this to Kings Lynn and West Norfolk Council: https://www.west-



NATURALLY SYDERSTONE – THE JAZZ SINGER

By the end of this month a voice out of Africa will be singing in our little English village. Imagine it tuning up over the Sahara, sharpening its notes in the Mediterranean, then bursting into full song on the Common, in the woods, or anywhere that has trees and bushes.

Don't be fooled by the resident great tit with its metronomic "tea-cher, tea-cher" that's been going since January. This new bird, one of the first migrants to appear in the spring, is an improviser. The chiffchaff does jazz.

Try to catch sight of a singing chiffchaff in the branches and it could be any one of half a dozen olive-brown warblers. It does have a trademark change of mind that nails this species, sorting out the chiffs from the non-chaffs. As soon as it lands, it shuffles into a different perching position. Every time. But spotting a ventriloquial 10cm bird in a whole tree — especially when it comes into leaf — is not easy. Best to focus on that song.

And such a memorable song too, if you imagine a character under the bird's feathers. It knows its name consists of two syllables, but either it doesn't know the order, or it likes to play with its name. This ad hoc composer presents us with a jaunty little tune – Variations on a Chiff and a Chaff. Off it goes with a random mix of chiffs and chaffs – "chiff, chaff-chaff, chiff-".

A warming Britain is benefitting this insect-eating warbler, encouraging it to flit over Hadrian's Wall, swelling numbers to something like 1.8 million pairs. Our chiffchaffs will sing on until well into June, and then, after a lull, in September you'll hear chiffchaffs again as northern birds migrate south and are fooled by the light into thinking it's spring in Syderstone.
