






#### **Syderstone Local History Group**

Syderstone Local History Group meets monthly in the village hall at 7.30pm on the first Thursday of the month and welcomes anyone with an interest in village history, its buildings, families or customs. The next two meetings are 1 June and 6 July starting at 7.30pm in the village hall.



Many Norfolk villages have a village sign, and this includes Syderstone. But what do the pictures mean? Here we unpack the symbolism behind the village sign we might walk or drive past every day.

Our sign is made up of four village scenes and one family crest.

- The first scene (top right) is the round tower village church of St Mary's, the oldest building in the village dating back to Norman times.
- The next (bottom right) is the famous Natterjack toad. These rare and protected creatures live on Syderstone common, one of only two inland sites in the UK where they are still found.
- The third (bottom left) shows Mr Richard Woods, a local farmer in a Massey Ferguson tractor ploughing a field next to the South Creake Road, with the church in the background.
- The final scene (top left) shows the Amy Robsart village hall, formerly the village school.
- In the centre lies the coat of arms of the Robsart family who owned the manor of Syderstone during Tudor times. It was Amy Robsart who was married to Lord Dudley, a favourite of Queen Elizabeth 1. She was found dead under suspicious circumstances.

Syderstone has three village signs. After receiving a grant, the Parish Council commissioned the two metal ones to be made, and they were unveiled in December 2005 by the local MP and Gerry Taylor who was then Chairman of the Parish council.

A further one was later carved by Terry Ashwell. He was concerned that the residents of Tattersett Road felt excluded, so he used his skills as a former master carver to create another sign which was unveiled in 2008.

## Old Syderstonians 31st Reunion - Saturday, 15th April 2023



#### **NATURALLY SYDERSTONE - Liberate your lawn**

You may be old enough to remember the clatter of a manual lawnmower; dad's job every week throughout the summer. You'll certainly be familiar with the annoying whine of today's electric mowers, especially annoying when it's not you doing the work and you'd been hoping for a peaceful summer's afternoon.

But what if you didn't do any more lawn cutting this summer? Neighbours might appreciate the quiet. Wildlife such as bees, butterflies, marmalade hoverflies and grasshoppers, would certainly value your forbearance.

If you're not familiar with "NoMowMay, then hold those rotor blades for a minute to hear more. It's an initiative that was started by nature charity Plantlife some years ago and has caught on in a big way. The idea is simple: you just don't cut your lawn, or part of your lawn again, until the autumn.

So what does that mean? Well, it gives all the pretty little flowers in your lawn, such as forget-me-nots and wild daisies, a chance to flower instead of being cut before their prime and provides a sweet nectar-abundant heaven for all of the insects that rely on them.

You'll also be creating a grasshopper nature reserve, because field and meadow grasshoppers need grass cover to thrive. You will soon hear the calming trill of grasshopper chirruping (made when they rub their back legs against their wings), and children will delight in seeing the little 'hoppers jumping around everywhere when you swish the grass.

What will the neighbours think? Make a virtue of it. Cut a neat edge around the outside, so they see that it's a deliberate policy and not lazy neglect. You could even put a sign up explaining to passers-by that you're creating your own grasshopper nature reserve.

You'll enjoy the rest and wildlife will benefit. What's not to like?

# Do you have any tales or recollections of ghostly happenings in or around Syderstone?

A year and a half ago, local author Dr Paul Lee published a book detailing the ghost stories and legends of King's Lynn and West Norfolk. He is now working on a second edition (hopefully to be published this October) and during his research he has uncovered many new tales and this has made him conscious that there are probably many more similar "unknown" accounts in our region.

Paul has spent a long time researching the ghosts of Syderstone, in particular the Old Rectory but there was only supernatural behaviour recorded there between 1797 and the mid-1840s. He has received unverified stories that ghostly phenomena was recorded in the 1920s and possibly as late as the 1990s (when it was a care home). Also of interest to him are stories linked to the former Lynn Arms pub, a woman screaming in a garden and even a phantom highwayman (he has very little information about the last two).
